The Glade Creek Grist Mill was built in 1976 using parts of the old Stony Creek Mill from Pocahontas County and the Onego Mill from Pendleton County. It's a replica of the former Cooper Mill, which once operated in the area.

Grandview was originally a part of the West Virginia State Parks system. In 1939, the state of West Virginia purchased 52 acres of land at Grandview to develop a day use park. The Civilian Conservation Corps built roads, shelters and a picnic area, which are all still in use today. After more than 50 years as one of West Virginia's most popular state parks, Grandview was transferred to the National Park Service in 1990.

## 6. Which United States President is believed to have bathed in the mineral waters at what is now Berkeley Springs State Park?

- A. Abraham Lincoln
- B. Theodore Roosevelt
- C. George Washington

In 1748, George Washington visited the area when he was 16 as a member of a survey party. He visited the springs regularly during the remainder of his life. An annual event celebrating George Washington's Bathtub is held in mid-March each year.
