September is Monarch Migration

Peak monarch butterfly migration is from September 14-26! This is the fourth generation that is flying all the way south to Mexico to their overwintering sites. Look for them as they are flying over and report them to Jounreynorth.org that helps with citizen science of tracking their great migration.

Join us this month for a variety of monarch butterfly classes on life cycle, migration, tagging, and monarch butterfly themed crafts and art!
