Nature Center Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

11:00 a.m. Cherry Lane Trail Hike— Join the seasonal naturalist at the fire circle of Sled Run for this loop walk along a section of Shay Trace to Cherry Lane and back exploring the trail plants, trees and wildlife. Trail is about one mile and expected to be 90 minutes. Leashed and well behaved dogs are welcome to attend this hike with their owner. YPP




- Please, observe that some park trails border private or National Forest property. Observing the park boundaries and aware of hunting seasons is advised
