#### 5:15pm - Poke Hollow Wetland Trail Hike

Meet at the "Poke Hollow" trail head parking lot for this guided hike through these geological significant headwater wetland as we discuss and examine a variety of topics such as why wetlands are beneficial for humans and wildlife, species of plants and animals found around the trail, and so much more! This trail also features a variety of forest types, early pioneer remnants, and 450ft elevation change to one of the highest points in the Park.

2:00pm – <u>Diana Fritillary Butterfly</u> Come to the Nature center as we discuss this unique butterfly. The Diana Fritillary was originally native to Arkansas but due to habitat loss and other factors the Fritillaries have moved into Appalachia. This species is threatened and protected because of the small population and recorded habitats for research. Through amazing efforts by Twins Falls State Park and researchers have determined this species has been thriving in specific locations around the park. We will discuss a variety of topics to promote understanding of the species.

**3:30pm – <u>WV SNAKES</u>** Come to the Nature for this discussion about our slithery friends found in West Virginia. We will cover a variety of topics such as identification, biological understanding, how to avoid negative encounters, what to do if bitten, and so much more! You may also see our resident snakes Willow, Whiskey, Coal, and Viper.

**5:15pm – <u>Horsepen Knob Trail Hike</u>** Meet the Park Naturalist at the "Horsepin Knob Trail" trail head parking lot for this hike. This hike is rated moderate with some steep inclines. The trail also features the unique natural habitat of the Diana Fritillary Butterfly, wildflower fields, and remnants of old pioneer homes.
