



TRAIL DESCRIPTIONS CATHEDRAL STATE PARK

CATHEDRAL TRAIL | 🕅 🌌 | 1.1 MI ONE WAY

BLAZE COLOR

TRAIL RATING NOT A LOOP TRAIL

This is the longest trail at Cathedral and crosses several bridges over Rhine Creek. Other branching trails can be accessed from this trail.

CARDINAL TRAIL | M 🗗 | 0.2 MI ONE WAY

TRAIL RATING NOT A LOOP TRAIL

This is a short trail in the back of the park property, making it a good wildlife viewing area.

GIANT HEMLOCK TRAIL | M 2 | 0.2 MI ONE WAY

This is a popular trail due to having some of Cathedrals largest Hemlocks along the trail.

This is the only trail thatt covers both sides of the park crossing route 50. Heavily wooded, use caution crossing highway.

This trial is slightly inclined with many bird sightings. This trail also branches into Cardinal Trail.

This trail has a wooded walk that accesses through a field, good wildflower and wildlife viewing area.

This is a very short trail connecting along Old Oakland road at the far end of the park, branches off into Cardinal Trail.

ABOUT THIS PARK

Cathedral State Park is the state's largest oldgrowth forest and contains one of the largest stands of virgin hemlock in West Virginia. Designated a National Natural Landmark, this 133-acre park offers sanctuary for these ancient trees, as well as 170 species of trees, ferns and wildflowers. During spring and summer, Cathedral State Park offers excellent hiking on its three miles of trails and unique photography opportunities.

HISTORY

This ancient forest was once the site of the Brookside Resort, which was built in 1882. Summer visitors from Washington and Baltimore flocked from the cities to the West Virginia mountains for the cool, clean air and natural beauty. In 1922, Brookside caretaker Branson Haas purchased the land, and later sold it to the state of West Virginia with the stipulation that the forest remain uncut. In 1966, the park was entered in the National Registry of Natural Landmarks.

Note: Restrooms are winterized beginning October 1 and close for the season. Please check wvstateparks.com for spring opening dates on our events list.

TRAIL RATINGS



EASIEST

Smooth graded trial with improved surfaces, few obstacles and gentle grades.



EASIER

Gentle off road trail with typical obstacles including gravel, loose rocks, sticks, bridges, narrow tread and trees.



INTERMEDIATE

Challenging trail with steep slopes, varying obstacles, rocks, significant grates and narrow tread.



Steep grades, loose surfaces, natural and man made obstacles, elevated features, berms, jumps, very narrow tread.



VERY DIFFICULT

Advanced riding skills required, Trails may not be continuously ride able or walkable and air time may be required.
