

TRAIL DESCRIPTIONS CEDAR CREEK STATE PARK

FISHERMAN'S TRAIL | M | 1.5 MI ONE WAY

TRAIL RATING | NOT A LOOP TRAIL

This trail begins at the Athletic Field and meanders along Cedar Creek to the park boundary. Many anglers use this scenic trail to access their favorite fishing spots.

GRASSY RIDGE TRAIL | 🕅 | 0.25 MI ONE WAY

TRAIL RATING | NOT A LOOP TRAIL

This trail is a favorite shortcut from the swimming area to the Grass Ridge picnic area.

NIGHTINGALE TRAIL | M | 0.5 MI ONE WAY

TRAIL RATING | NOT A LOOP TRAIL

This trail runs above the picnic area and was laid out as a project of the Nightingale 4-H Club.

NORTH BOUNDARY TRAIL | 🕅 | 1 MI ONE WAY

TRAIL RATING | NOT A LOOP TRAIL

This trail is an extension of Two Run Trail and winds over interesting shale barrens to an area of large timber.

PARK VIEW TRAIL | 🕅 | 1.75 MI ONE WAY

TRAIL RATING | NOT A LOOP TRAIL

This rugged trail begins near the bridge across Cedar Creek and provides many scenic views of the park.

STONE TROUGH TRAIL | 🕅 | 3 MI

TRAIL RATING

This is a loop trail that begins at the campground behind camp site #11 and runs up Long Lick to its source. This trail then turns south and climbs a ridge where it passes a stone water trough, hand-carved from solid rock and belleve to be more than 100 years old. Stone Trough then joins Two Run Trail to return to the campground down Tobacco Barn Run at camp site #55.

TWO RUN TRAIL | 🕅 | 2.5 MI ONE WAY

TRAIL RATING | | NOT A LOOP TRAIL

This trail begins at the campground and follows Two Run to its source. From there it follows a series of abandoned logging roads and animal trails until it meets Stone Trough Trail and returns to the campground.

TRAIL RATINGS



EASIEST

Smooth graded trial with improved surfaces, few obstacles and gentle grades.



EASIER

Gentle off road trail with typical obstacles including gravel, loose rocks, sticks, bridges, narrow tread and trees.



INTERMEDIATE

Challenging trail with steep slopes, varying obstacles, rocks, significant grates and narrow tread.



FXPFRT

Steep grades, loose surfaces, natural and man made obstacles, elevated features, berms, jumps, very narrow tread.



VERY DIFFICULT

Advanced riding skills required, Trails may not be continuously ride able or walkable and air time may be required. From scenic vistas to beautiful overlooks, hiking trails at West Virginia's state parks and forests lead to breathtaking mountain scenery. Along the way create lasting memories but remember to leave no trace behind in Almost Heaven.
