# Nature Center Hours - 12:00pm. - 5:00pm.

- 12:00pm. 5:00pm. "Self-Guided Scavenger Hunt" Stop by the Nature Center during business hours to pick up this self-guided scavenger hunt. Once you have found all of your items, return to the nature center before 5:00pm for a small prize.
- **12:00pm. "Introduction to Native Ferns"** Meet Caleb West, our Seasonal Naturalist at the Twin Oaks Trail for this easy paved loop trail as you pass by vernal pools and varying forest types allowing you to view several species of native ferns. Caleb will discuss identification, ecology and much more on this walk. The loop trail is 0.5 miles.
- **2:00pm. "The Buzz About Cicadas"** Meet at the Amphitheater parking lot for this program presented by Summer Naturalist David "Bugs" Stover. As he will discuss the various broods and their behaviors as well as what to expect from this year's emergence.
- **4:00pm.** "Ask a Naturalist" Caleb West our Seasonal Naturalist will be stationed near the front desk to help answer any park related questions you may have.

7:30pm. "Wetland Symphony" – Meet at the Poke Hollow Trail Head for this program presented by Caleb West our Seasonal Naturalist, bring a chair and maybe a blanket as temperatures tend to cool off this time of evening. Guests will sit beside one of twelve unique head water wetlands in West Virginia, "The Poke Hollow Wetland". As you sit and listen to the evening chorus frogs, we will discuss topics such as wetland animals and the importance of the Pole Hollow Wetland.

## Saturday, June 7th.

#### Nature Center Hours – 12:00pm. – 5:00pm.

- 11:00am. "Falls Trail Guided Hike" Meet at the Falls Trail parking lot. Caleb West, our Seasonal Naturalist will be leading this informative hike along the Falls Trail. Caleb will discuss the local flora and fauna of this area, you will pass by the two water falls that is the namesake of "Twin" Falls. This trail is paved to the first falls then becomes very rocky and is 1.25 miles. And is a loop trail.
