Saturday, July 5, 2025

8:00 am. Early Bird Walk - Join our volunteer bird walk leader at the Nature Center for a morning of birding. Expect 1 to 2 miles of easy walking along roads and trails. Dress for the weather, bring water and a snack. Qualifies for the Junior Naturalist program.

10:30 am. Jefferson's Giant Claw! - Join the Seasonal Naturalist to learn how some mysterious bones found in a West Virginia cave changed what we know about the prehistoric world. Qualifies for the Junior Naturalist program.

1:00 pm - Twisted Tie Dye! - Join the Nature Center staff to create your own Blackwater Falls t-shirt souvenir. Supplies are limited. Youth sizes are \$8.00. Adult sizes are \$10.00. Set up closes at 3:00 pm!

Monday, July 7, 2025

11:00 am. Bee Garden Craft - Join the Nature Center staff to make your own mini greenhouse containing a variety of bee-friendly flower seeds. Take it home and watch them grow. Craft fee is \$4.00. Qualifies for the Junior Naturalist program

1:00 pm. Slime! - Join us for a short presentation about some animals that make and use slime. Afterwards, make your own bag of slime to take home. Qualifies for the Junior Naturalist program.

Tuesday, July 8, 2025

11:00 am. Weather Window Craft - Join the Nature Center attendant to learn about the clouds while you make you own weather window craft, then go outside and see what kinds of clouds you can see. Craft fee is \$3.00.

11:30 am. Weather Film - Is there any truth to the folklore around the weather? Find out during this educational film. Run time is about 35 minutes. Not rated. Qualifies for the Junior Naturalist program.

1:00 pm. Nature Apps 101 - Join the Summer Naturalist to dig into the do's and don'ts of using apps to identify and report the things you find. Emphasis will be on iNaturalist, but other apps may be covered as well. Qualifies for the Junior Naturalist program.

Wednesday, July 9, 2025

11:00 am. Weasels and Their Cousins - Join the Seasonal Naturalist to learn all about these rarely seen and often misunderstood animals. Qualifies for the Junior Naturalist program

1:00 pm. Christmas in July! - Join the Nature Center staff to decorate some Christmas themed suncatchers. Craft fee is from \$1 to \$4 per craft.

Thursday, July 10, 2025

1:00 pm. Let's Talk Turkey - Join the Summer Naturalist to hear all about the American Wild Turkey and how conservation efforts brought them back from the brink of extinction. Qualifies for the Junior Naturalist program.

9:00 pm. Full Buck Moon Hike - Can you name the species of owl by its calls? Can you identify the nocturnal animal by the color of its eyeshine? Are they called Fireflies or Lightning Bugs? Meet at the Harold Walters Nature Center to look and listen for creatures of the night. The full moon will rise as we make our way around the park. Easy walking along park roads, this program lasts about an hour. Dress for the weather and your comfort. Qualifies for the Junior Naturalist program.

- All Programs meet at the Harold Walters Nature Center unless otherwise specified in description.
- Plan to arrive five minutes early for programs. A late arrival may effect your participation in activity. A no show within seven minutes of start time may cancel activity.
- Pets should be physically leashed while enjoying the park. Activities that are pet Friendly are indicated in description. See Park Rules and Regulations about length of leash.
- Protect the environment and yourself by staying on designated blazed trails. Building or constructing unauthorized trails or simply walking off trail harms the landscape and wildlife that call the area home. Avoid short cuts and social trails that are not on the park map or blazed.
- It is suggested to walk with a partner, carry water and perhaps an individually wrapped snack. Carry the 5 c's. Don't know what the 5 c's are then ask at the Nature Center
- Be observant of adjacent private property or Monongahela Forest Property lines while hiking.
- Children ages 12 and under need to be accompanied by an adult on
- While walking on park roads a person should be facing oncoming traffic. While biking on park roads a person should ride with the flow of traffic and use hand signals. Bikers yield to hikers on trails. All yield to equestrians where they are permitted in some parks.
