



# BLACKWATER FALLS STATE PARK

## Friday, September 12, 2025

**1:00 pm. Keeping Dark Skies Dark** - There is a solution to light pollution... and it's you! Learn why dark skies matter, what you can do to help, and how Blackwater Falls State Park is making changes as part of our dark skies initiative. **YPP**

**2:00 pm. Leaf-A-Long Walk** - Join the Summer Naturalist to creep into Fall along Balsam Fir Trail. Learn a little bit about tree identification while enjoying the first hints of Fall colors. Trail is rocky and root-strewn in places with a few short, but steep elevation gains. Wear sturdy shoes and dress for the weather. This is a 1.5 mile loop that begins and ends at the Nature Center. A little over an hour long. **YPP**

## Saturday, September 13, 2025

**11:00 am. Bats!** - Are bats really as blind as we think they are? Join the Seasonal Naturalist to learn all about these flying mammals, including what kinds of bats can be found in West Virginia. Includes a free craft. **YPP**

**1:00 pm. Watercolors and Leaves** - Join the Nature Center staff to get creative with watercolor paints and crayons to make some leaf-themed artwork. Free craft. **YPP**

**1:30 pm. Nature Documentary - Trees** - How do trees talk to each other? Where can you find a tree older than the pyramids? Join us to learn some amazing facts about trees. 35 minutes long. Not rated. **YPP**

## Sunday, September 14, 2025

**10:00 am. Bird Walk** - Join a naturalist at the Sled Run parking area to spend the morning looking and listening for birds. Enter the forest on Shay Trace Trail and return via the slope of the sledding hill. Wear sturdy shoes and dress for the weather. Some loaner binoculars may be available. Walking of about a mile. Around an hour. **YPP**

**11:00 am. Suncatchers** - Join the Nature Center staff to make a colorful suncatcher to take home. Paint either a leaf or a googly-eyed critter. Craft fee is \$2.00.

**1:00 pm. Who Hibernates?** - Join the Nature Center staff to explore our animal display and see if you can name all the West Virginia animals that hibernate. Which ones migrate? Which animals are active all winter long? **YPP**

## Monday, September 15, 2025

No Naturalist On Duty

**11:00 am. Amphibian Craft and Movie** - Join the Nature Center staff to make a "stained glass" salamander craft. After that, stick around for a 35 minute documentary all about frogs, toads, and salamanders. Film is not rated. **YPP**

## Tuesday, September 16, 2025

No Naturalist On Duty

**11:00 am. Nature Documentary - Animal Homes** - Join us for this three-part series looks at how animals around the globe build their homes. From bird nest and bear dens to beaver lodges and spider webs. The first of 3 one hour-long episodes will begin at 11 am, with the other episodes to follow. Rated G. **YPP**

## Wednesday, September 17, 2025

**11:30 am. Mini Birdhouse Craft** - Join the Nature Center attendant for this easy-to-assemble craft. The kits all slot together, although a little glue helps. Paint it up and take it home. Several designs to chose from. Craft fee is \$2.00.

**2:00 pm. Owls of West Virginia** - Join the Seasonal Naturalist for a presentation all about these flying nocturnal predators. Participants may dissect an owl pellet during the program for the cost of \$2.00. Supplies are limited. **YPP**

**10:00 am. Elakala Trail Walk** - Meet a park naturalist in the lobby of the Blackwater Falls Lodge. This loop hike of just over a mile will include Elakala Trail and parts of Balanced Rock and Shay Trace Trails. Trail is uneven, very rocky, and root-strewn in places. Wear sturdy shoes and dress for the weather. This hike will take a little over an hour, with short interpretive stops along the way. **YPP**

**12:30 pm. Astronomy Weekend Welcome Reception** - Takes place in the Harr Conference Center. Guest speakers to follow.

**2:00 pm. Shaving Cream Art!** - Join the Nature Center staff for an exciting and interesting craft that uses watercolors and shaving cream to print colorful designs on paper. Great for turning into a card. Craft fee is \$1.00. Come make a masterpiece! **YPP**

**7:00 pm. Evening Along the Lake** - Join the Seasonal Naturalist to walk along Pendleton Lake looking and listening for birds, beavers, and more. Wear sturdy shoes and dress for the weather. About 1/2 mile. Around an hour. **YPP**

Saturday, September 20, 2025

**9:00 am. Astronomy Events Begin in the Harr Conference Center**

**10:00 am. Easy Bird Walk** - Join the Summer Naturalist at the Nature Center to locate some of our feathered friends. Some loaner binoculars may be available if you don't have your own. Look and listen for birds around the Nature Center, at Pendleton Lake, and along park roads. Mostly level surfaces, easy walking up to a mile. About an hour. **YPP**

**1:00 pm. Weather Window Craft and Movie** - Join the Nature Center attendant to learn about clouds while making a weather window then watch a 35 minute long film all about the weather. Film is not rated. **YPP**

**2:00 pm. Meet Our Turtles!** - Join the Nature Center staff to learn all about turtles. During the program you will meet our educational animal ambassadors and learn their stories. Program will begin with a free, fun turtle craft. **YPP**

**Young People For Parks**

- All Programs meet at the Harold Walters Nature Center unless otherwise specified in description.
- Plan to arrive five minutes early for programs. A late arrival may effect your participation in activity. A no show within seven minutes of start time may cancel activity.
- Pets should be physically leashed while enjoying the park. Activities that are pet friendly are indicated in description. See Park Rules and Regulations about length of leash.
- Protect the environment and yourself by staying on designated blazed trails. Building or constructing unauthorized trails or simply walking off trail harms the landscape and wildlife that call the area home. Avoid short cuts and social trails that are not on the park map or blazed.
- It is suggested to walk with a partner, carry water and perhaps an individually wrapped snack. Carry the 5 c's. Don't know what the 5 c's are then ask at the Nature Center.
- Be observant of adjacent private property or Monongahela Forest Property lines while hiking.
- Children ages 12 and under need to be accompanied by an adult on programs.
- While walking on park roads a person should be facing oncoming traffic. While biking on park roads a person should ride with the flow of traffic and use hand signals. Bikers yield to hikers on trails. All yield to equestrians where they are permitted in some parks.




