Track Your Eastern Newt Sightings!

Citizen scientists who see an eastern newt in any life stage are encouraged to report their sighting to the WVDNR by completing a short survey with questions about your observation.

Submissions with a photo are encouraged. Data collected through the survey will help WVDNR biologists prepare for the potential arrival of a newly described chytrid fungus that is deadly for eastern newts. The survey will take two years to complete (2026-2028).
